MLA Internet Citations

To properly cite from the internet, determine which type of source from which you are citing. This is for internet parenthetical citations ONLY. Follow the examples below.

Citing a source with an author and a page number:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" (Snodgras, pg. 5).

Citing with NO author and a page number:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" ("The Man Who Was Missing", pg. 5).

*For no author, use the TITLE of the ARTICLE. This will be in "quotations" in the cite.

Citing with an author and section:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" (Snodgras, sec. 6).

Citing with NO author and a section:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" ("The Man Who Was Missing", sec. 6).

Citing with an author and paragraph:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" (Snodgras, par. 4).

Citing with NO author and a paragraph:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" ("The Man Who Was Missing", par. 4).

*For several paragraphs: (Snodgras, pars. 4-7) OR ("The Man Who Was Missing", pars. 4-7).

Citing with an author and part:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" (Snodgras, pt. 3).

Citing with NO author and part:

The man claims he was with the group "...until 5 in the morning" ("The Man Who Was Missing", pt. 3).

*For multiple parts, follow the same format for multiple paragraphs.

**For multiple paragraphs/parts/sections NOT in order, use semicolons to separate the paragraphs/parts/sections: (Snodgras, par.4;7-9).

If the ARTICLE TITLE is more than 10 words, use only the first 5 words and then ellipses. This is for the parenthetical citations ONLY. A Works Cited entry is the complete title.
